Westside CAN Center continues engaging with partner organizations serving the Westside community and to continue the implementation of the community policing and outreach programs. The donation of food was distributed to families of the Westside and Kansas City.

During the donation ceremony last week, Director of the Redemptorist Community Service Julie McCaw said, "Redemptorist Center is receiving a semi-truck of food donated by the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints in partnership with Governor Parsons as part of the Kansas City Giving Machine which was located at Crown Center during the holidays. We are excited the Governor is joining us today along with Eider Nielsen. On this truck sits 40,657 pounds of food that we will be putting into our community! We cannot say thank you enough. The right to food is one of the most basic human rights."

McCaw added, "Too many in our community do not have the resources they need to realize this right. Too many parents are struggling to put food on the table. Too many students are tying to learn while ignoring their empty bellies. Too many children aren't getting the nutrition they need to grow up healthy and strong. Too many seniors today, right now as we are all here, will fore-go a meal because their cost of living or medication is just too much. And too many people don't know where their next meal will come from. Nearly two years ago our food pantry faced significant challenges and change. Covid arrived, and we all faced something very unknown. With a staff of 7 and an army of volunteers we moved with change and continue to serve those who needed us most. The Center added hours and stayed open until every person in line was helped each day, we never closed. We found partnerships and networks in our community that allowed us to grow at a rate no one saw coming. Since March of 2020 Redemptorist Center has given out over 3,000,000 pounds of food's said McCaw.
